On September 17, 2003, applicant filed a request to have the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's records changed to reflect a name change.

**It is ordered:**

The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's records are amended to reflect the carrier's name as **Ardwin Inc D/B/A Ardwin Logistics**.

Within 30 days after this decision is served, the applicant must establish that it is in full compliance with the statute and the insurance regulations by having amended filings on prescribed FMCSA forms (BMC91 or 91X for bodily injury and property damage liability, BMC34 or 83 for cargo liability, or a BMC84 or 85 for property broker security and BOC-3 for designation of agents upon whom process may be served) submitted on its behalf. Copies of form MCS-90 or other "certificates of insurance" are not acceptable evidence of insurance compliance. Insurance and BOC-3 filings should be sent to Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration, 400 Virginia Avenue, SW, Suite 600, Washington, DC 20024.

The applicant is notified that failure to comply with the terms of this decision shall result in revocation of its operating rights registration, effective 30 days from the service date of this decision.
